



How EDS Products Help To Create Jobs

- ▶ Local Workforce Investment Boards and educational partners use sub-state projections data to identify potential job growth for training job seekers who may need to change careers or stay competitive within their own field of expertise.
- ▶ Long-term sub-state projections forecast demand for occupational employment over time. The occupational projections allow students and jobseekers to make informed decisions about whether a career path is worth pursuing based on the future demand of an occupation.

How EDS Products Help To Create Jobs (Continued)

- ▶ Educational entities use occupational employment by educational and training level estimates and industry and occupational employment projections to plan courses and career paths.
- ▶ Wage estimates are used by Local Workforce Investment Boards (LWIBS) and AJCCs to educate job seekers so that they can make informed career decisions; economic developers use wage data for business attraction/retention; educational career counselors use wage data to assist students in career planning; and businesses use wage data to keep their competitive edge in the local community.

How EDS Products Help To Create Jobs (Continued)

- ▶ Producing occupational wage estimates at the various percentiles can assist employers and businesses in comparing wages to stay competitive and compliment economic develop efforts to attract new employers.
- ▶ Localized wage and staffing patterns are used to produce regional planning information to identify target industry clusters and demand occupations to support the business needs of the CWIB, LWIBs, AJCCs, education, private industry groups, and economic developers.
